

Did you know that in every accident case here in New York, in every medical malpractice case, there are three key disputes that are involved in every single one of these cases? So now, what are the three key disputes in every one of these cases? Number one: who's responsible? Is it you or is it me? Or is it somebody else? Number two: did the wrongdoing, the carelessness actually cause you injury, yes or no? Then the third dispute is what's the true extent of your injuries, how badly are you really hurt? The defense will argue that up and down, claiming that you are not as badly hurt as you claim you really are. So, those are the three key elements that you really need to focus on when understanding how the defense looks at your particular case and how the jury is going to see the clear dispute show up in a head to head fight between who's responsible. We say the people you are suing are responsible. They turn around and say "No, we're not." That creates a dispute. Then what happens? So now, we claim that the carelessness of the people you are suing caused you injury. They turn around and say "Hey, even if we were careless, we didn't cause your injury," and now they'll come up with some other excuse about why you suffered your injury. Then the third dispute is we claim that your injuries are very significant and permanent, and the defense does everything possible to try and minimize and reduce the value of your injuries, claiming to the jury "Listen, your injuries really are not as bad as you claim them to be." So why do I share this quick information with you? I share it with you just to give you an insight and an understanding into what goes on here in the state of New York in an accident case and in a medical malpractice case.
